## Update for Parents – New Term Arrangements September 2024

Dear Parent/Carer,

We are looking forward to welcoming back all our learners on **Tuesday 3<sup>rd</sup> September 2024**, as we commence a busy and exciting new academic year. In particular, we would like to extend a very warm welcome to our new pupils who will join us for the very first time in Year 7. We hope they enjoy their first day of secondary school.

The school day will commence at 8.30am and end at 2.50pm as normal. The building will be open to learners from 8.00am and we would appreciate your support to enable a prompt start to the day with learners in their registration rooms by 8.30am at the latest. On arrival, all pupils will be greeted by their form teacher and Head of Pupil Progress who will guide them through the school's more detailed procedures. Buses will bring children to the school car park. For parents who wish to bring children by car, you are welcome to use the car park.

On arrival, learners should head to their year group corridors as follows:

YEAR 7	E Corridor
YEAR 8	B Corridor
YEAR 9	D Corridor
YEAR 10	C Corridor
YEAR 11	A Corridor

Staff will be on hand to direct pupils if needed. Please note that our usual safety procedures at the end of the school day remain in place. The school gates will be closed at 2.45 – 3.00pm and **no cars or buses are to move in the carpark until all pupils have left to ensure a safe and calm exit.**

All learners will be issued new timetables and planners on their first day, and we will begin on week one.

### Transport

School buses will operate normally from **Tuesday 3<sup>rd</sup> September**. This service is run by Carmarthenshire local Authority and not the school. If you experience any issues, please contact them on 01267 228326. Bus passes have been issued directly to pupils via post with details including timetables and routes. ### Catering arrangements

Lunch arrangements will be very similar to last year with Y7-9 utilising the main canteen and Y10-11 accessing the converted Drama Hall canteen. Both canteens serve the same food and provide a large seating area for pupils to enjoy their lunch. There will also be an outdoor hatch offering lighter snacks on a "Grab and Go" basis. At the start of the year, we will stagger lunchtimes to allow Year 7 a little more time to find their way around and become familiar with the systems.

The school operates a cashless system through ParentPay. Year 7 learners will have received information regarding catering in schools including a parent consent/allergy form that needs to be returned before pupils can be added to the biometric cashless system. **Please ensure all year 7 pupils and new learners bring their signed consent form to school on their first day.** A copy of the form is added to the end of this newsletter if needed. During morning break, the canteen will not be open to serve food and therefore, we recommend that pupils should bring their own snacks and drinks as needed.

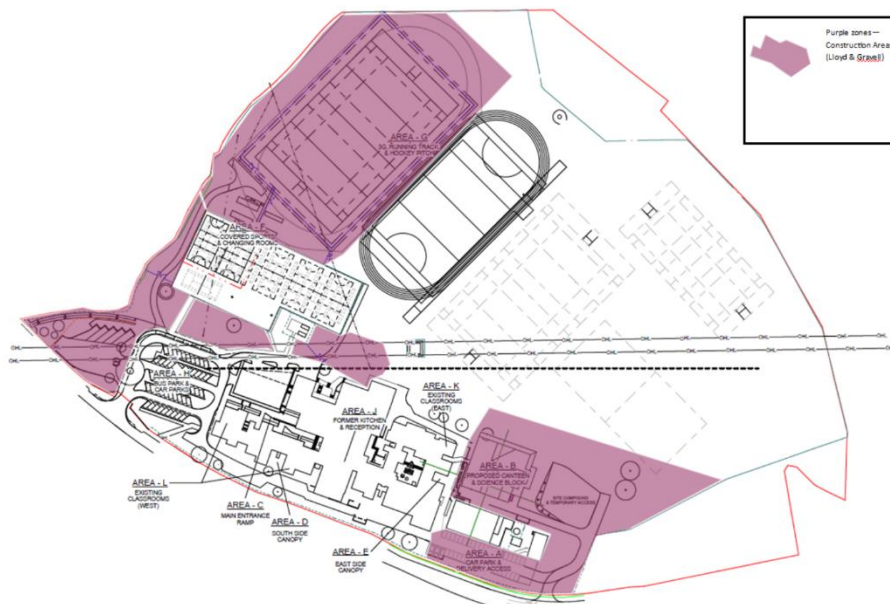
## Uniform

## Building works

It has been a busy summer as the major developments at Bryngwyn are underway. These will lead to a new 3G pitch and sporting facilities along with a new canteen and Science block. The developments are significant and will provide outstanding facilities for our learners and the community. As the building works go on, there will be some disruption to our normal operations and we will communicate with you regularly with updates on the progress and anything that may affect the way we operate. We would ask for your patience in this time as we work together whilst we wait for the completion of these exciting facilities.

For the start of term, pupils and parents can access the site as normal and pupils will receive a full briefing for any 'on-site' changes, including health and safety procedures. Please could you ensure that your child is aware of the location of the build sites (in purple below) and inform them that these will be out of bounds until further notice. All build areas are securely fenced with clear signage to avoid any confusion.

## CASHLESS CATERING

Carmarthenshire County Council's School Catering Service collects and uses biometric information about your child to provide our cashless catering system, which makes it easier for pupils to pay for school meals. The information we use is an algorithm based on your child's fingerprint (we do not record the actual fingerprint). This information remains within the payment system within the school.
